## CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT INITIATIVE PETITION SIGNATURE VERIFICATION CHECKLIST (Rev. 02/2014)

(Sections 99.097 and 100.371, Florida Statutes, and Rule 1S-2.0091, Fla. Admin. Code)

## I. A constitutional amendment initiative petition may not be verified as valid unless <u>all</u> of the requirements for the petition are met, to include:

The	voter's	name.
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**Note**: Per s. 99.097(3)(a), Florida Statutes, a name on the petition that is not in substantially the same form as the name in the voter registration system shall be counted as a valid signature if, after comparing the signatures on the form and in the voter registration system, the supervisor of elections determines that the petition signer is the same as the registered voter.

The voter's address, to include the city and county.

**Note**: While most addresses will likely be a street address, it is not required. A post office box with the city and county listed is an acceptable address. The address need not be the address on the voter's registration record. *See* s. 99.097(3)(c), Florida Statutes -- if a voter lists an address other than the registration address, the supervisor of elections shall treat the address as if the voter had listed the voter's registration address. The absence of a zip code on the form will not prevent an initiative petition from being verified.

- The voter's date of birth <u>or</u> voter registration number.
- The voter's <u>original</u> signature.
  - The date the voter signed the petition, <u>as recorded by the voter</u>.

## II. Also, before a petition may be verified as valid, the supervisor must ensure that the signer:

Was a registered voter in the <u>state</u> at the time of <u>signing</u> and <u>verification</u> of the petition.

**Note:** If the signature is from a registered voter in another county at the time of verification, the supervisor must notify the sponsor of the misfiled petition.

Signed the petition timely, meaning that:

If signed <u>on or before</u> May 19, 2011, the voter had not signed the petition form mo	ore
than <u>4</u> years prior to the signature verification date.	

If signed a	after May 19, 201	l, the voter had	not signed th	e petition form	more than $\underline{2}$
years prior to the sig	gnature verificatio	n date.			

Had not previously signed a petition form containing the identical initiative which had been verified as valid.
